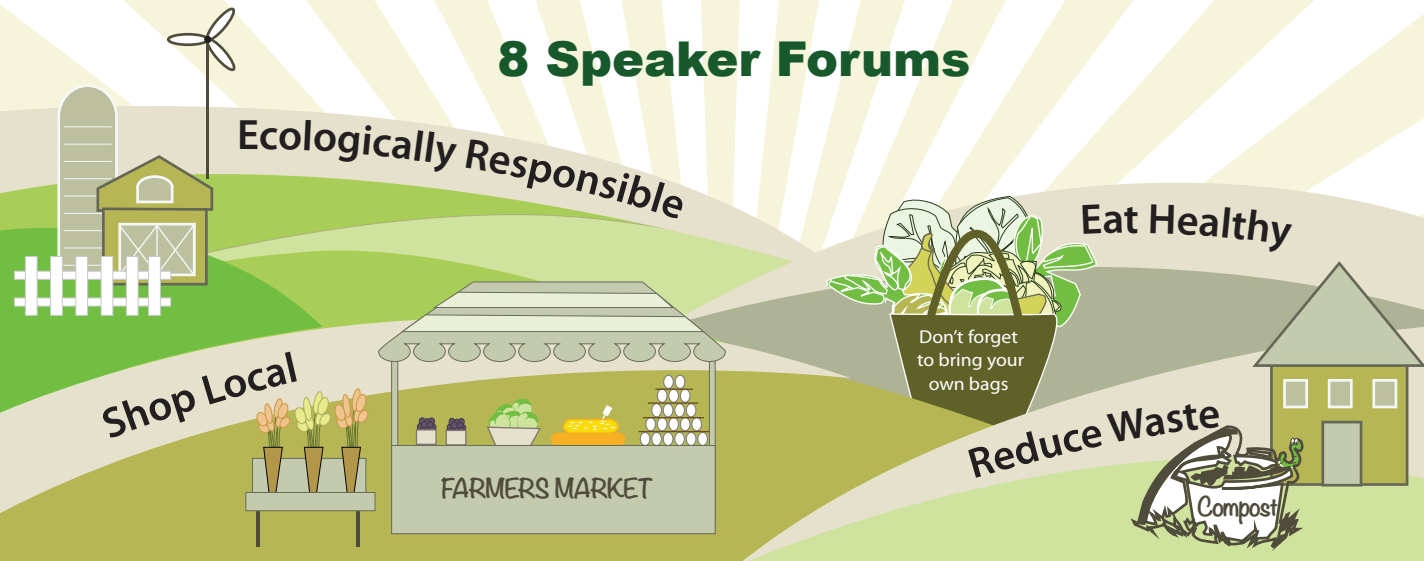

Locally Grown Food - Alison Parker is co-owner of Radical Root Farm, a certified organic farm in Libertyville, IL. She will discuss the importance of growing food in a way that positively affects the environment, contributing to the health of the community and surrounding wildlife. She will also discuss how ecological growing also greatly impact the community's environmental protection, including contributing to clean soil, clean water and clean air.

Food: Think-Eat-Save - Lower your Foodprint - Arlene Hickory and Pat Walter, members of organizations concerned about environmental issues will focus on the water dimension of food production, the unsustainability of industrial agriculture, food and health issues and the United Nations 2013 campaign to reduce food waste. Access to adequate food as a human right, workers' rights, fair trade and related social justice issues will also be discussed.

Importance of Youth Engagement in the Environment – Susana Figueroa of Faith in Place (Lake County Office) and Brian DeLaCruz (Our Lady of Guadalupe Church) will share their experience with local environmental projects.

Lake County Forest Preserves – Katherine Hamilton-Smith, Director of Public Affairs and Development for the Lake County Forest Preserves, will provide an overview of the Green Youth Farm program.

New Solutions for Our Energy Needs - A Solar Update on both local and global trends in clean energy production. Dave was a former AP Environmental Science Teacher and Sustainability Coordinator at Stevenson High School and is now working with C & E Solutions which provides solar installations and educational services. He helped the Libertyville School District install their large solar installation.

Climate Change 101 – Rick Knight, a chemical engineer, will share a portion of his presentation, “The Science of Climate Change”. He has made presentations to many highly receptive audiences in the Chicago area and provides clarity on the subject.

Climate Action Update – Julie Nowak, Group Leader of Citizens’ Climate Lobby (CCL) Lake County, will talk about why she is optimistic that Congress will come together on climate.

Zero Waste - What it is and what you can do to reduce your footprint. We will focus on how to reduce your household discards including food waste, paper, packaging and other materials. Barbara Klipp chairs the Sierra Club National Zero Waste Communities Team, the Sierra Club Illinois Chapter Zero Waste Committee, is a member of the Conservation Committee of the Lake County Sierra Club, Woods and Wetlands Group, co-founder of Incinerator-Free Lake County and Executive Director of their new non-profit, Midwest Sustainability Group. She served on the Lake County 60% Recycling Task Force and on the Citizens Advisory Committee for the most recent Lake County 5-Year Solid Waste Plan Update.
